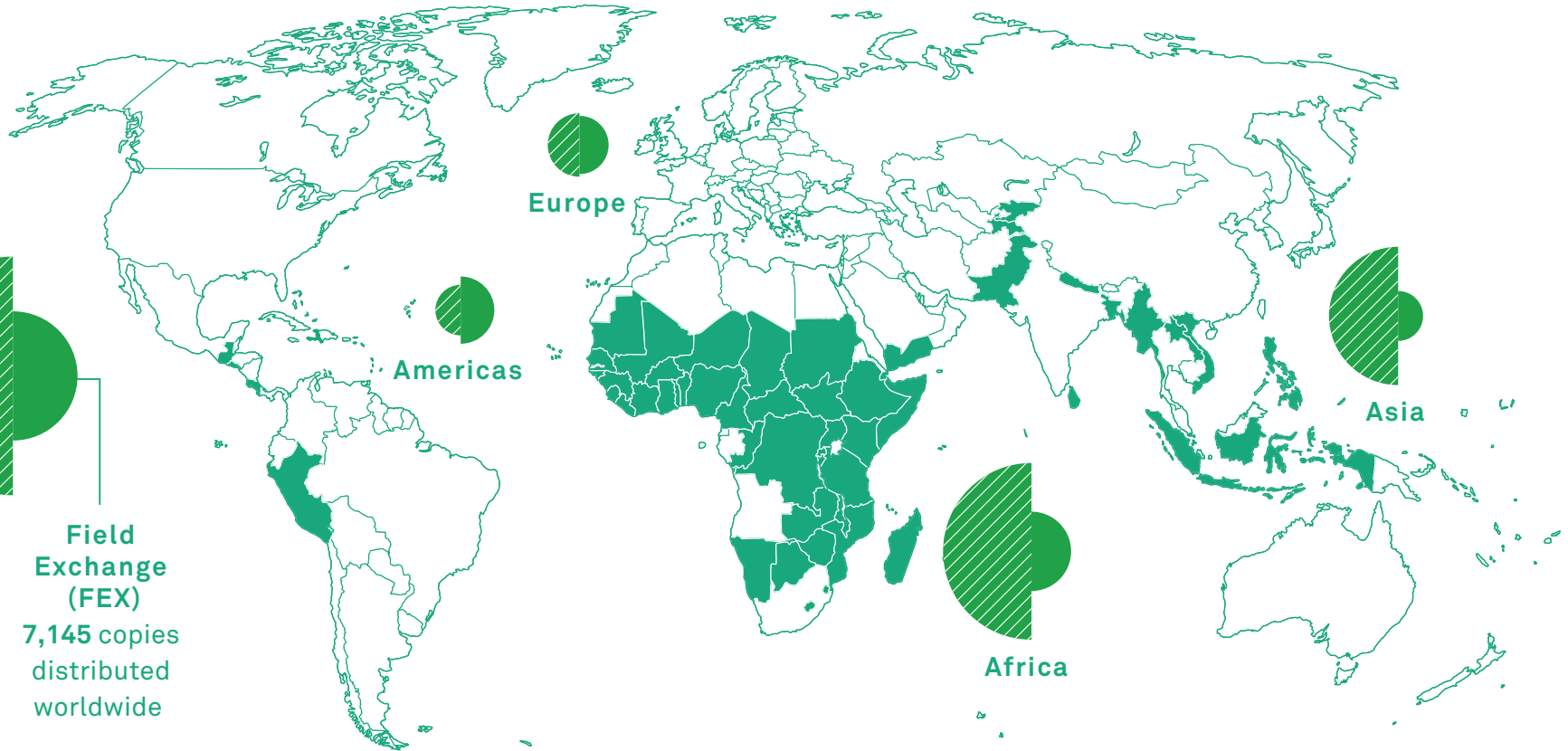
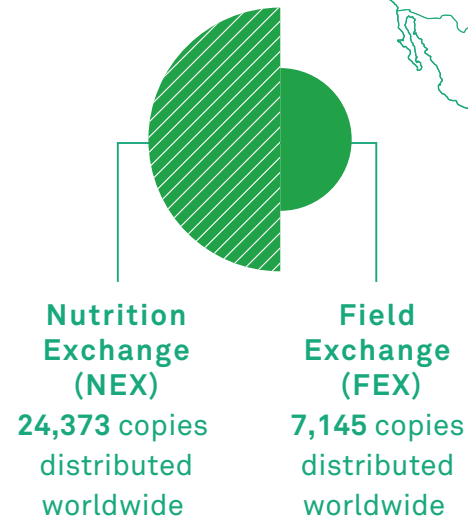

## About ENN

ENN is a UK based organisation focused on strengthening evidence and know-how for effective nutrition interventions in countries prone to crisis and high levels of malnutrition.

ENN uses a variety of approaches to capture and disseminate nutrition related programmatic

learning and technical evidence, including documentation and learning through structured discussions and meetings.

ENN's 3 core knowledge products are the publications Field Exchange (FEX) and Nutrition Exchange (NEX), and en-net, an online technical support forum.

- 1995** Agencies meeting in Addis Ababa following the Great Lakes emergency identify urgent need for capture of programming experiences in the emergency food/nutrition sector
- 1996** Formation of ENN by international agencies, donors and research groups – first edition of FEX produced
- 2009** Launch of en-net: a platform for nutrition sector peer-to-peer exchange and expert advice
- 2011** NEX becomes an annual publication
- 2015** ENN begins knowledge management work to support the SUN Movement

## ENN Knowledge Products

ENN knowledge products capture field experiences and technical expertise relating to nutrition specific and sensitive programming from around the world. Our network, users and contributors come from diverse backgrounds – academia, government, civil society, media and local and international development agencies – and work in nutrition and related sectors including health, Water, sanitation and hygiene (WASH), agriculture, food security, livelihoods, and social protection.

ENN is committed to developing free and open source knowledge products and platforms – ENN printed publications are distributed globally free of charge (including postage) and all materials are available to download online. ENN manages expert moderation of en-net – an open source, online platform.

In 2015 ENN began work on a 4-year project to support knowledge management (KM) across the SUN movement. Supported by DFID and Irish Aid, ENN will contribute to the capture, dissemination and exchange of knowledge and learning in the movement with a focus on countries

defined as Fragile and Conflict Affected States.

A global team of KM specialists will be dedicated to this work with a UK based KM coordinator and region based specialists in Asia and Africa. The first stage of this work will be to include SUN specific content in all ENN publications and platforms:

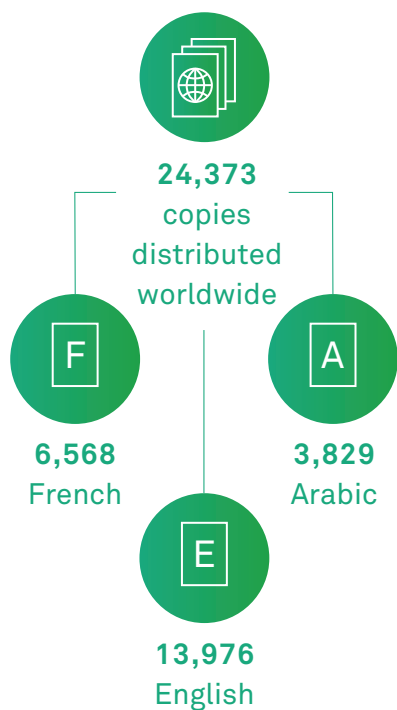
