Operational Guidance on Breastfeeding Counselling in Emergencies *IFE Core Group (2021)*

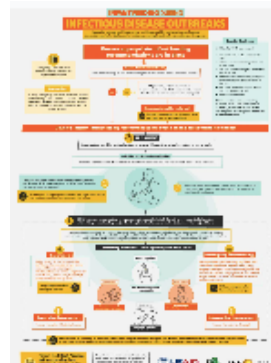
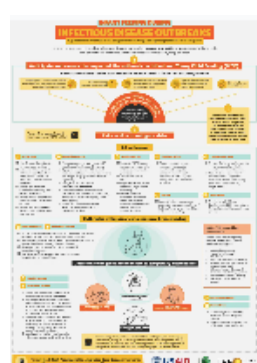
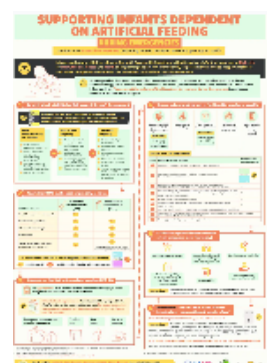
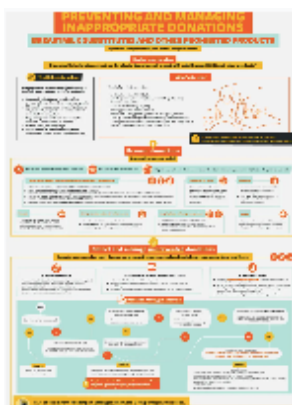

INFANT AND YOUNG CHILD FEEDING IN EMERGENCIES: TEN YEARS OF PROGRESS

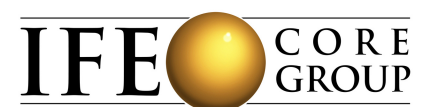

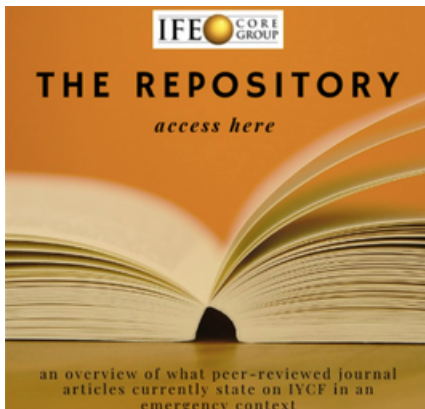

This document is a compilation of country commitments to the Decade of Action on IYCF and will be used for routine programme monitoring for results.



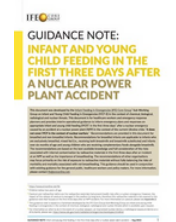
Advocacy Brief: Breastfeeding in emergency situations *Global Breastfeeding Collective (2018)*
