Background Infant Feeding Practices/Current Situation (outputs)

- 1. Low Exclusive Breastfeeding rates in non-emergency
- 2. High rates of bottle/formula feeding in non-emergency times
- 3. General perception that formula is as good as or is better than breastmilk
- 4. Mother to child transmission of HIV is an important cause of child mortality

Current IYCF/IFE Programme (inputs)

- 5. No national Code of Marketing or existing Code is not enforced
- 6. No government policy on IFE or policy is not implemented
- 7. Few government staffed trained on or knowledgeable about IFE
- 8. Few local and international NGOs trained on or knowledgeable about IFE
- 9. Few lactation consultants/specialists available/accessible during emergencies
- 10. Perception amongst public and media that women cannot breastfeeding during emergencies
- Unsolicited donations of formula/milk powder received during emergencies
- 12. General rations/emergency food distributions do not contain suitable foods for complementary feeding (CF)
- 13. General rations/emergency foods distributions often include formula/milk powder
- 14. People in charge of emergency coordination do not prioritize IFE
- 15. International or local NGOs operate independently of the national emergency response.
- 16. Rapid assessments seldom include information about IF
- 17. Poor understanding about what indicators to include on IFE in assessments
- 18. Services to encourage and support BF during emergencies are not often provided
- 19. Emergency areas seldom have places suitable for women to breastfeed
- 20. There are no systems to minimize risks of formula feeding
