

Considering Wasting and Stunting approaches together requires action by diverse stakeholders

Recommendations drawing on the work of the Wasting and Stunting Technical Interest Group (WaSt TIG)

Policy Makers

Develop cohesive joint polices to prevent wasting and stunting and their consequences, including considerations for children who experience concurrence.

Develop prevention strategies with a critical focus on **women's health and nutrition.**

Given the relationship between wasting and stunting, **include wasting treatment as part of stunting policies.**

Donors

The burden of malnutrition remains unsolved. Integrating programmes for wasting and stunting offers one mechanism to further reduce the burden, potentially at a lower cost. Promote funding for such programmes.

Preventing malnutrition starts before birth. Fund nutrition interventions targeted at women of reproductive age, pregnant women and mothers to prevent infants being born already at-risk.

> Evidence gaps prevent the best prevention and treatment for malnourished children. Fund research for identified priority gaps.

Programme Designers & Implementers

Consider ways to integrate wasting and stunting initiatives given the potential to improve malnutrition and reduce costs.

Preventing wasting and stunting starts before birth. Interventions should seek to **improve women's health and nutrition, pregnant women's nutritional status as well as mothers of at-risk infants.**

Help us understand how we can improve wasting and stunting together by sharing evidence of integrated programmes in practice.

Researchers

We know how to identify children with the highest risk of mortality, but we don't yet know the level of treatment and intensity required. Work with us to research this.

We know that **prevention programmes should be integrated**, but we don't yet know how. **Help us research, evaluate and draw out learning on this.**
